# **Show summary**

Playing happily on their private pink carpet, each day is full of fun and stories for friends Alix, Sasha, Lou and Noa. From afar, the outside world seeps into their games. A plane flies overhead? They grow long, long wings. It starts raining? No problem: they splash in the puddles, instantly waterproof. But everything changes when they get terrible news from the outside: the colour pink is for girls. Suddenly, the perception of others becomes a major preoccupation, muddling their imaginations in the process. They are boys! This place – this pink place – is not for them. Not anymore.

# Is Pink only for girls?

Draw a unicorn. Fight. Get dirty by jumping in puddles. What's for boys only? Or girls too? Who decides this? While the question of gender identity is at the heart of our social issues, this theater-dance creation gives young people living material to reflect on the fate they will reserve for stereotypes associated with boys or girls in their future. This show invites them to enter life with their little bundle of unique experiences and to design the future with audacity, brilliance and freedom.

# **Tools for teachers**

# **Pre-show Movement Workshop**

Preparatory workshop related to the themes and form of the show. Led by a professional dancer, this workshop before the show will allow young people to discover and experiment with different ways of putting their bodies into play and creating bridges between words and movement. This activity, lasting 60 minutes, is included in the price.

#### **Study Guide with educational tracks**

Document that explores the creative process of the show's creative team; introduces philosophy as a tool to help children to question and exchange extensively with their classmates; explores the concepts of identity, diversity, fear, adaptation and acclimatization, all the while reminding teachers that children see concepts differently than adults. The study Guide is available online on Le Petit Théâtre's website.

# **Post-show discussion**

15-minutes exchange with the performers of the production can be organized at the end of the performance, at no additional cost.

**Complementary workshop after show** Offered on request, at a cost of \$180, this 60-minute workshop will open up a space for discovery, exchange and discussion around the themes of identity and self-affirmation.
